Comprehensive Fee (Grades K-4) Students in grades K-4 pay a comprehensive fee of **\$675** which includes milk or juice during lunch, general supplies including workbooks and other consumable materials, field trips, and art supplies.

Optional Lunch Fee (Grades K-4 Only): \$1,050 for the academic year

Comprehensive Fee (Grades 5-12) Students in grades 5-8 pay a comprehensive fee of **\$2,350**; students in grades 9-11 pay a comprehensive fee of **\$3,025**; Seniors pay a comprehensive fee of **\$2,195** (*Seniors do not pay for TRIP WEEK). This fee covers the costs for TRIP WEEK, hot lunch, one locker key, ERB testing expenses, yearbook, and the co-curricular program (including sports). In addition, this fee supports the use of computer technology, applicable consumable materials, and the continual updating of the technology program. This fee does not include textbooks, field trips, graduation fee, transportation, or any other fee. An additional \$50 Fuel Surcharge for Trip Week is required for students in Grades 5-11 only and will be added as a separate item on your child's Enrollment Agreement.

Trip Week (Grades 5-12) In addition to regular field trips, students in grades 5-11 are required to participate in extended trips to various places in the United States and Canada. **The cost for Trip Week is included in the Comprehensive Fee.** No other field trips are included in this cost.

Tuition Deposit and Payment A deposit for tuition is required for both returning students (as part of the re-enrollment agreement) and for new students to reserve the applicant's place in class (Deposits for PS/Pre-K: \$500; Grades K-12: \$1,300). The deposit is applied to the total tuition. Information on the optional tuition payment plan is explained on the Enrollment Agreement. Payment plans **require** participation in the Tuition Protection Plan (TPP). TPP is **optional** for Pay in Full payments only.

Textbooks (Grades 5-12) Textbooks are required at the beginning of each school year. Books can be ordered online at <http://direct.mbsbooks.com/elginacad.htm> or by calling 1-800-325-3252. You may also purchase textbooks at your local bookstore or at an online bookstore of your choice.

Extended Day (Grades PS-8) Optional All students in Grades K through 8 may participate in our Extended Day Program. [PS and PK students require prior approval from the Early Childhood Director.] Program hours are from 7:00-8:00 a.m. and 2:30-6:00 p.m. available Monday through Friday on days when school is in session. Drop-In Basis: **\$6.70** per hour billed monthly; 5 days: **\$2,850** per year; 20-Hour Card: **\$125**. For Extended Day questions, please call the Lower School at 847-695-0315.

Bus Transportation A bus route may be offered if sufficient demand requires securing a private school bus. Annual Fee: **\$2,800** per child

Parent Association Dues Each family is charged \$75 per year to support the activities of the Parent Association.

Varsity Store (Grades K-12) Optional School supplies may be conveniently purchased from the Varsity Store. A \$25 deposit toward these supplies is recommended.

Contributions (Grades PS-12) The tuition and fees do not cover the entire cost of educating students at Elgin Academy. Therefore, we hope that parents will include the Academy when considering charitable, tax-deductible contributions. All parents are contacted asking their financial support for the Annual Fund in the fall and EXTRAVAGANZA, the annual auction, in the spring. *(Updated: 7/16/08)*
